
'Are You OK' throughout Week 9, including following the four steps to starting a conversation:

Building works are starting!

The \$10 million building works are about to get underway at our school! The entire building will be renovated, a new building will be built with 8 large classrooms and the old BER (Library, Room 8 & 9) will be removed from our site. The first stage of the project will be the refurbishment of our administration and Early Education Program (EEP). Our office will be relocated to the Aurora demountable next door to our current office, and the EEP classes will be relocated to Room 8 at the back of our school. We will have signs to direct you and we will keep the school community informed of changes via Compass.





Primary Deaf Sports Day – Thursday, 27th October

It's back! We are very excited for all Furlong Park school aged children and our staff to be participating in the 2022 Primary Deaf Sports Day in term 4, on **Thursday 27th October** from 10am-2pm at the Tom Kelly Athletics Track in Doncaster.

Children of prep to Grade 2 age will participate in some fun tabloid activities and a 50m sprint, while children of Grade 3 to 6 age will compete in the following events:

- 100m sprint
- 200m sprint
- Vortex throw
- Long jump
- High jump

Children will need to bring their usual snacks, lunch and water bottle to school which will travel on the bus with us to the venue. At the track there are water fountains to enable water bottles to be refilled throughout the day.

Please note that the bus taking us to the event leaves at 9am sharp so any children being dropped off at school that morning will need to arrive at 8:45am please. The bus is not able to wait for late comers.

Parent consent will be required for children to attend, and we will do this electronically using the Compass app soon. If you need any support setting up or accessing the Compass app, please contact our office.

Families are welcome to attend on the day. The track is in George Street, Doncaster.



Hearing Australia visits

Hearing Australia audiologists visit Furlong Park regularly throughout the year to provide a free service for our children. Children whose parent/carer have returned a consent form will participate in activities including otoscopic examination, maintenance of hearing devices, impression taking, troubleshooting of devices, etc.

The audiologist will be onsite Tuesday, **11 October** (accompanied by an Auslan interpreter).
