NEW UNIFORM ITEMS!

With the cooler weather soon approaching, we've decided to introduce a new uniform item to our shop.

It will keep your children dry when the rain starts to pour and warm when the cold air starts to give them goosebumps. The Walker Dry & Cosy Jacket features elastic cuffs, a zip front with a storm flap, front patch pockets to keep the hands warm and a concealed hood in its collar.

We currently have limited stock available for first come, first serve orders in sizes 4-16.

Pre-orders will then be taken. Once an order has been made it can take up to 2 weeks before the item arrives, however we must receive a minimum of 10 orders from parents/carers before we are able to proceed with an order of the items. We recommend that this is an additional layer to children's jumpers so it may be worth purchasing one size up from their regular size.

Cost of the jacket is \$40.00.

Also coming soon are our Red Communication Bags and Summer Hats with logos. Should you require a replacement communication bag, you will be able to purchase a new one for \$8.50. Summer hats will be available for \$13.00.

HEALTHY SWIMMING

Swimming is a great way to stay fit and active, and an important skill for life. As our school participates in swimming programs, it's important we all take steps to stop the spread of germs at the pool.

This summer, the Victorian Department of Health advises there has been an <u>increase in the number of people infected with cryptosporidiosis (crypto)</u> – a type of gastroenteritis. Some people are attending pools while infectious, which spreads the infection to others.

To keep pools safe and clean for everyone, please follow these healthy swimming steps before we dive into the pool:

- do not swim if you have diarrhoea
- shower and wash with soap before swimming
- wash your hands with soap after using the toilet
- avoid swallowing pool water
- change nappies in nappy-change areas only.

Please encourage your child to follow the above steps to support everyone's safety in pools. Please also keep your child absent from swimming lessons at school if they have had gastroenteritis or diarrhoea in the 14 days before the lesson.

- **2.** On a brown paper bag (or any other packaging suitable to write your order down and enclose cash) write the following:
- Childs name
- Room number
- List of menu items
- Cost of menu items
- Total order amount
- 3. Place the cash inside the bag
- 4. Place the lunch order in your childs bag
- **5.** Your child will pop their lunch order in the lunch basket upon their arrival to school in the morning

Students will receive their lunch orders in time for first play at 11am.

HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN SCHOOL: BUILD THE HABIT OF GOOD ATTENDANCE EARLY SCHOOL SUCCESS GOES HAND IN HAND WITH GOOD ATTENDANCE!

Did you know?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important.

Good attendance will help children do well in high school, tertiary education and at work



What you can do

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots
- Introduce your child to teachers and classmates before school starts to help transition

- Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick
- Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counsellors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbour, or another parent
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session

SUPPORT FOR PARENTS AND CARERS TO BUY SWIMWEAR INCLUDING MODESTY SWIMWEAR

Our swimming program begins in the first week of Term 2 and will run every Friday until 21st June.

Eligible families can receive support to cover the cost of swimwear, including modesty swimwear, through the Affordable School Uniforms program delivered by State Schools' Relief.

People from culturally and linguistically diverse communities are overrepresented in drowning statistics. Making modesty swimwear available supports all students to become more involved in swimming and water safety education.
